


# The Mosaic: Conserved Lands, Habitat, & Trails in Greater Portland

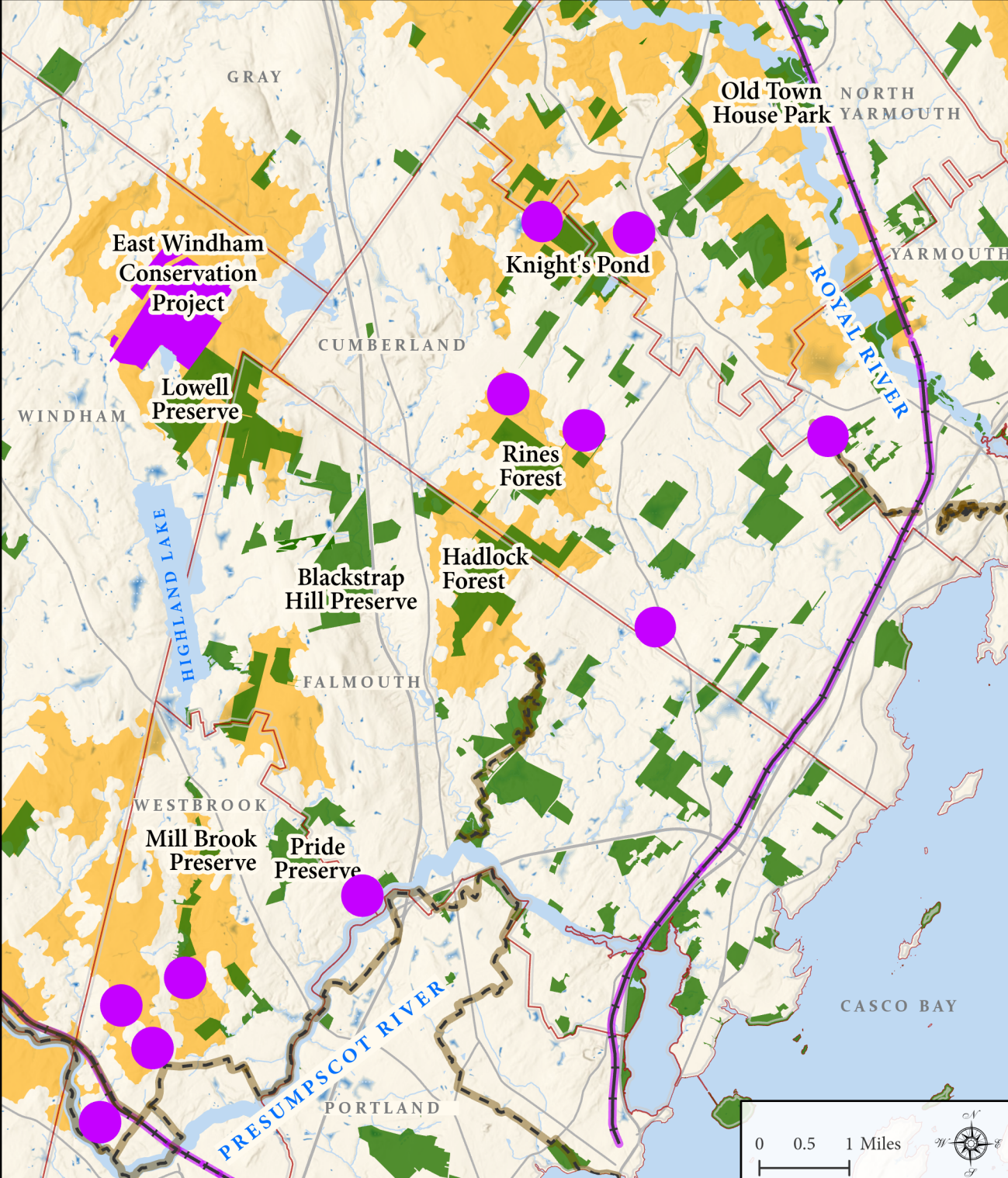

## Regional Collaboration

Presumpscot Regional Land Trust, Falmouth Land Trust, Chebeague & Cumberland Land Trust, and Royal River Conservation Trust are working together to amplify conservation impacts in Greater Portland. This map is important for coordinating land trust efforts and showing our supporters the connections between current conservation efforts and where future conservation projects could be most impactful for connected wildlife and recreational corridors.

## Greater Portland Growth

Outside of Boston and its surrounding counties, Cumberland County is the fastest growing county in all of New England. Westbrook, Windham, Falmouth, Cumberland, Yarmouth, and North Yarmouth form a ribbon of the fastest growing populations in Cumberland County.
